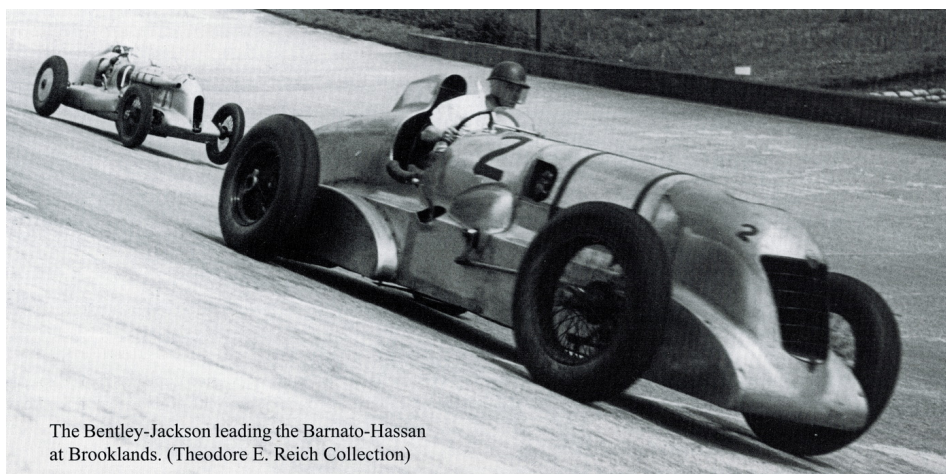

Description:

"Mother Gun" was the first Bentley 4½ Litre model entered as **Bentley team car at Le Mans in 1927**. In **1928 the Team car finished 1st and in 1929 2nd**. Rebodyed for Brooklands in 1932 and 1934, upgraded to 6½ Litre in 1934 and rebuilt to single seater Brooklands Special by R. R. Jackson in 1936/37. **Extensive Brooklands racing history** including three 130 mph Badges and holder of various speed records.
