Description:

The VW T1 Samba is considered the most sought-after model in the Bulli series and continues to enjoy worldwide popularity to this day. Its characteristic 21 windows, large folding sunroof, and striking panoramic look make it a true cult vehicle. Originally designed as a comfortable coach for discerning travelers, the Samba epitomizes the spirit of the 1960s like no other car. It combines iconic design with practical versatility and is now an absolute classic with cult status.

According to the **VW certificate**, this VW T1 Samba was produced in Germany and was then delivered to San Francisco in December 1966. Back in Germany it was extensively restored on an **almost rust-free California base**. The engine was replaced with a **more powerful 1600cc unit**. The vehicle impresses with highlights such as a **folding sunroof, pop-out front windows, 6 pop-out side windows**, a continuous front bench seat, Blaupunkt radio, additional instruments, electronic ignition, and a **12-volt system**. Whitewall tires and a trailer coupling round off the picture. German registration is available. Documented with a valuation report and VW certificate, this is a rare opportunity for Bulli enthusiasts and collectors.
